The League of California Cities has selected the city of San Rafael as a 2007 Helen Putnam Award winner.

The city received the grand prize in the category of Community Services and Economic Development for the renovation and expansion of Pickleweed Park Community Center.

The Helen Putnam Award for Excellence recognizes outstanding cities that "deliver the highest quality and level of service in the most effective manner possible."

The award is given annually in 11 categories. Of the 115 nominations this year, 27 cities were honored with awards, according to the league.

Established in 1898, the League of California Cities is a member organization that represents California's incorporated cities. It advocates on behalf of cities at the state Capitol, provides its members with professional development programs and information resources, educational conferences and research and publishes a magazine, "Western City."
